Hickory Fire Department becomes Internationally Accredited Agency

The Hickory Fire Department is now an Internationally Accredited Agency with the Commission on Fire Accreditation International (CFAI).

This designation is awarded to agencies that meet or exceed the rigorous standards and criteria established through the CFAI's voluntary self-assessment and accreditation program.



Hickory Fire Department (HFD) is one of approximately 300 agencies to achieve Internationally Accredited Agency status with the CFAI and the Center for Public Safety Excellence, Inc. (CPSE). HFD joins an elite group of just 17 accredited career departments in North Carolina.

Fire Chief Matt Hutchinson stated, "The achievement of Accredited Agency status demonstrates the commitment of our department to provide the highest quality of service to our community. We have been able to use the Commission on Fire Accreditation International's process as a proactive mechanism to

plan for the future and locate areas where we can improve the quality of the services we provide."

The CFAI accreditation process enables fire and emergency service agencies to examine past, current, and future service levels and internal performance and compare them to industry best practices. Accreditation allows the organization to determine community risk and safety needs, develop community-specific Standards of Cover, evaluate the department's performance, and establish a continuous improvement method.

Chief Hutchinson continued, "During this process, we focused on performance measures and learned to leverage technology to make data-informed decisions that prepare the department for future growth. One example has been the use of automatic vehicle location equipment, which identifies the closest vehicle to an emergency. As a result, that vehicle is dispatched to the incident and therefore allows faster response and resources to a scene. Other areas of focus included recommendations of exhaust removal systems and gear washers to assist with firefighter safety and wellness."

Deputy City Manager Rodney Miller added, "This accreditation shows to the community that our fire department is data-driven, outcome-focused, strategic-minded, well-organized, adequately trained, and properly equipped."

In addition to the CFAI accreditation, Hickory Fire Department also holds an ISO Class 1 Rating through the Insurance Services Office. An ISO Class 1 rating is the highest rating possible and ranks the Hickory Fire Department among the nation's best, as less than 1 percent of fire departments achieve this distinction.

Single ground mulch is now available for just \$25 per 3-yard scoop (full-size pickup truck load) at the City's Yard Waste Facility on Cloninger Mill Road. The facility is only open on Fridays from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m., and will operate with those hours until all supply is gone. Spring Reminders

Pool Fill Adjustments: Call the Collections Division at 828-323-7424 at least one business day BEFORE filling up your swimming pool from the ground up so you may receive an adjustment on your water bill. City staff MUST read your water meter before and after the pool is filled to ensure an accurate volume.

Lawn Sprinkler Meters: The City of Hickory must be contacted to activate irrigation meters to avoid potential tampering charges being added for meters that were turned on by an unauthorized person. To activate a lawn sprinkler meter, call Collections at 828-323-7424 Monday through Friday between 8:30 a.m. and 5 p.m. Also, remember to call Collections at the end of the season to inactivate the service and discontinue monthly base charges.
