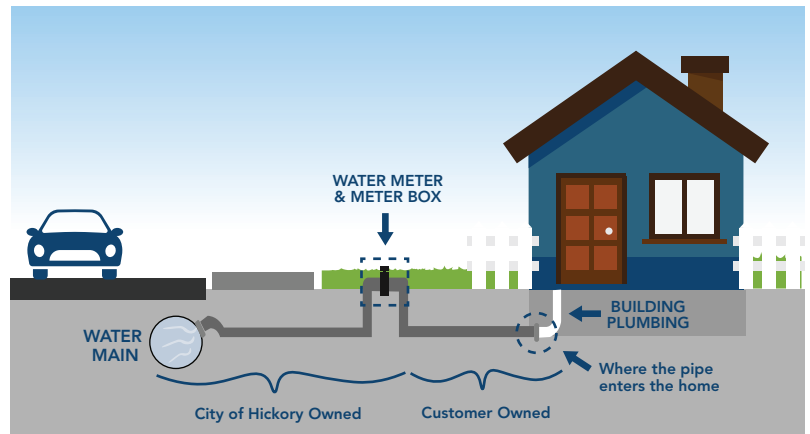
Water Service Line Materials Customer Survey



What is the Lead and Copper Rule (LCR)?

The Lead and Copper Rule of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is a federal regulation designed to eliminate lead and under certain circumstances galvanized service lines.

The primary goal of the Lead and Copper Rule is to ensure that drinking water in communities across the U.S. remains safe and free from contaminants.



In January 2021, the EPA updated and issued revisions to the original LCR under the Lead and Copper Rule Revisions (LCRR).

How can you help keep Hickory's drinking water safe?

As required by the EPA, the City of Hickory is developing a service line material inventory for our water system. Identifying water service line materials helps protect our water customers from the potential health hazards of lead.
